

## OUR TEACHING ARTISTS

Dancer and choreographer **Joi Jamison** has been teaching dance since 1998, working with Norfolk State University's Dance Theater and the Effingham Street YMCA in Virginia. She has performed as Norfolk's Nighthawks Dance Girl for the semi-pro football team. She was a dance instructor for the Young Peoples Guild for Performing Arts School in Portsmouth and served as Dance Director for the Virginia Thunder Dance Team, Kelli's Dance Explosion and the Virginia Crusaders. Jamison has conducted many dance and cheer workshops for children and adults.

Artist **Tamara Morgan** began painting about 30 years ago, trying out about every medium she could get her hands on. Through the years she has also taught classes in decorative painting, acrylic, oils and watercolor. It never ceases to amaze what people can achieve when they have the tools, guidance and inspiration to learn to paint.

Stained glass artist **Mack Porter** began teaching classes in his craft in 1972. His commissions include a window for a meditation chapel in a Michigan hospital - and the front door windows at the Roberts-Mozley House, the home of the Cultural Arts Center, where he exhibited in 2003.

Visual and performing artist, **Terumi Todd** brings her Japanese heritage, along with American and other cultures to her art. She specializes in fabric arts including art quilts and fashion design. Currently her works are on display at the Fayette Arts Center, Arts Clayton Gallery, and the U\*Space Gallery in Atlanta

Drummer **Tom Harris** is the director of the Inner Harbour African Drum Corps. He has studied African and other drumming techniques for many years both in the U.S. and in Africa. His students rejoice in the power of rhythms they learn - and sometimes they even get to make drums during his workshops!

Children, 7 - 11 years old, will explore a wide variety of art disciplines including ceramics, dance design, painting, papermaking and tile, working with five expert and experienced teaching artists. Campers (a total of 50 can be registered) are divided into five groups of ten by age.

Fees for the week are \$75 for the first child (\$60 for CAC members) with a \$5 dollar discount for siblings. Early drop off (8:30 am) and late pick up (5:30 p.m.) can be arranged at no additional fee with the Parks and Recreation staff.

Daily schedule will include three art making sessions, morning and afternoon breaks (snacks provided by Douglas County Department of Parks and Recreation) and lunch (provided by campers). The final afternoon will be spent at the Cultural Arts Center working on a camp project with everyone participating and on the display of works to be presented during our Celebration of Achievements, Friday, April 9<sup>th</sup>, 5 until 6 pm. Families and the community are invited to attend.
