“This year three performers will bring their curricula-based entertainment into three schools and then follow it up with a free performance at the library for parents, grandparents and siblings to enjoy the show together,” said Davina Grace Hill, Executive Director of the CAC. All the shows are about 1 hr long, completely free and in an entertaining way, impart educational concepts. “For example, being charmed by butterfly puppets is just plain fun, leaving with information about the butterfly life cycle and Douglasville’s own butterfly gardens trail is the lasting impact,” said Hill.
